### THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

What caused Jonathan to be drawn to David? Was it hearing David answer Saul's question, "Whose son art thou?" with the gracious unassuming words, "I am the son of thy servant Jesse the Bethlehemite." Was it recognizing David's spiritual heart and desiring his fellowship? Did he know of David's anointing and desired to assist him toward the day he would be king? Did he see in David a better king than himself and chose to promote David for the good of the nation of Israel?

How do you react toward a possible rival? Do you give your help, encouragement and praise in an attempt to aid that person to grow in grace, accomplishment and success? Or are you jealous, selfish and too proud to help another who might get more recognition than yourself?

3. With a javelin (v 11).
4. Saul thought to make David fall by the hand of the Philistines (v 25).
5. Behaved himself wisely (vs 5, 14, 20).
